

Boundary Survey

The goal is to validate the site conditions versus the researched documentation.

How Does a Surveyor Perform a Boundary Survey?

We start the process by obtaining documents via the Recorder of Deeds, municipal offices, and other survey records. This reveals any possible discrepancies between documents and to get the "full picture." Next, field staff visit the site. They use electronic equipment to take the measurements. Additionally, we examine the site and determine the exact location of the property boundaries. Finally, our surveyor will ensure that proper markers establish each property corner.

How Much Does a Boundary Survey Cost?

No two properties are identical, nor are two boundary surveys. Many factors contribute to the cost of a boundary survey.

These include:

- Size A one-acre property will cost less to survey than a ten-acre site.
- Location Remote locations can cost more than those in suburban or urban locations.
- Time of year A wooded property costs less when there are no leaves on the trees.
- Topography A flat site will be easier to survey that a steep site, thus costing less.
- Complexity A complex boundary requires additional time, thereby costing more.


A typical boundary survey can cost from several hundred dollars to several thousand dollars based upon the above factors.
