

Flood Elevation Certificates

Why Get an Elevation Certificate?

A Flood Elevation Certificate is a FEMA document that insurance companies use to calculate risk. This in turn determines insurance premiums. Additionally, it provides a safety net for anyone living in flood prone areas. That said, cost can be a limiting factor.

This is where obtaining an Elevation Certificate is valuable. If a property does not have a certificate, insurers apply the highest premium. An elevation certificate may even find that insurance is not necessary.

How Do I Get an Elevation Certificate?

Obtaining a certificate is simple, but requires a professional land surveyor. To prepare a certificate, ACA starts by researching existing FEMA data. We then perform a field survey, with electronic equipment, to determine the flood zone, lowest floor, and lowest adjacent grade. This survey also includes taking photographs. Finally, we prepare any needed drawings and complete the form.


A floodplain survey can cost from several hundred dollars to a several thousand dollars based upon the above factors. That said, it is usually a small cost compared to the future potential savings on premium.
