


Pool Permit Plans

What Does a Pool Permit Plan Consist Of?

A Pool Permit Plan reflects the proposed improvements associated with constructing a pool. It is a simplified version of a building permit plan.

We start by performing a topographic survey. This survey provides the property lines, existing structures, and elevations of the property. We then add the proposed pool, associated patio, elevations, grading, and erosion control practices. In some cases, a project requires a simplified stormwater management design. Larger projects result in more earth disturbance or impervious area. Thus, these projects could require a full stormwater management design.

Project timelines vary depending on size of project and regulations. Thus, it is important to start the process as soon as possible to avoid delays in your schedule.

How Much Does a Pool Permit Plan Cost?

No two projects are identical and regulations vary by municipality. Therefore, the cost to prepare a plan varies too.

There are many factors that can impact the cost. These include:


- Stormwater Requirements Municipal regulations vary from no requirement, to simplified or full analysis.
- Soil Testing Projects requiring a full stormwater design may require soil testing.
- As-Built Survey Some municipalities require a survey of the finished construction.
- Topography A steep or wooded site adds complexity and time.
